





#### Black History Week

It was a busy day for Early Years and KS1 on Wednesday 21st September with the start of Black History Week! We were visited by Freshwater Theatre to take part in some cultural drama workshops. In the morning, nursery and reception went on a special Early Years story hunt starting in England with 'Amazing Grace', then onto Kenya in 'Handa's Surprise' and finally to the Caribbean in 'Island Counting'. The children loved taking part in all of the interactive challenges.

In the afternoon it was KS1's turn, the children were going to see the tales of how Anansi became king of all the stories and how the zebra got his stripes. The children got very involved in all of the actions and were fantastic acting out the different animal roles. We celebrated the new African stories that we had learnt by creating a dance to some traditional music.



#### RE: RINGWORM

Ringworm, a fungal infection that can affect the body scalp and hair has been identified in the school .

#### Some important facts about ringworms.

Contrary to what many people believe, ringworm is a fungus. It is commonly called ringworm, instead of tinea corporis, because the rash on the <u>skin</u> is usually in the shape of a ring.

Ringworm is recognised by itchy, red, raised, scaly patches that may blister and ooze. The patches often have sharply-defined edges. They are often redder around the outside with normal skin tone in the centre. This may create the appearance of a ring. The skin may also appear unusually dark or light.

It is highly contagious until treatment is started so children must not come to school until they start treatment. Most chemists sell antifungal creams, which treat ringworm. If applied two times daily, the ringworm should be gone in two to three weeks. You will no longer be contagious after 48 hours of treatment.

To prevent the spread of ringworm in the school, it is advisable to check your child regularly and the condition should be treated <u>at once</u> by consulting your doctor and following his/her recommendations.
