(23rd June)

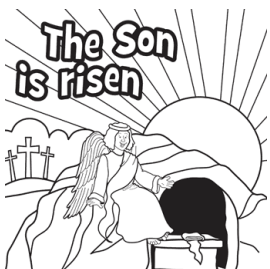
On this day we remember how much Jesus loves us all.

John 20:19-21

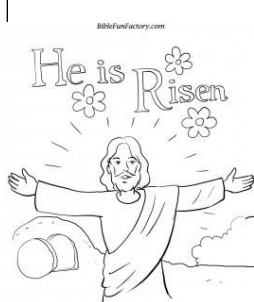

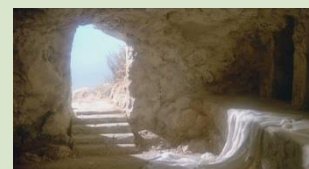
