We also strive to ensure that all children equally make outstanding progress in their learning, through identifying need and under performance and putting in place additional resources and support programmes.

Early support and intervention strategies for those who need additional help in reading and number have also been partially funded through the pupil premium as well as more able children through projects such as the Brilliant Club.

Our extensive range of opportunities beyond the school day, enhance children's development. This grant has also contributed towards the costs of these activities that were previously funded by other grants.
